WELCOME BACK TO THE GREAT RIVER SHAKESPEARE FESTIVAL on the Mississippi River

Welcome back! And welcome to the great outdoors! Over the years, on beautiful summer evenings, many of you have asked us to do outdoor performances. Some of us have wanted to try it. We've always wanted to be downtown and closer to the river that gives us our name, and, well, here we are.

We've never done this before. We've never painted circles on the lawn or asked you to use headphones on an app to hear us better (or invited you to read your program on your phone). We are going to learn a lot this summer, and we are going to learn it together. We're going to have some glorious evenings by the river, and we may spend some evenings defiantly watching a play in the rain.

In her opening remarks to the company, Co-Associate Artistic Director Tarah Flanagan told us about the Japanese art of kintsugi. Artists reassemble broken pottery using gold. Rather than attempting to hide the repair, the brokenness becomes part of the beauty of the object. Perhaps many of us have been broken in some way by the last year. We return as different people. This summer, we celebrate our renewal. As Estella says in Great Expectations: "I have been bent and broken, but - I hope - into a better shape."

And, in her opening remarks to the company, Co-Associate Artistic Director, Melissa Maxwell, reminded us all that, though we are not considered "essential workers", our work is essential. For many of us, theatre is a calling; it is a ministry. In the same way that medical professionals tend to the body or religious leaders administer to one's spirituality, theatre practitioners minister to the soul; we come together in service to the community, putting a mirror up to the world in hopes that the reflections we study will help us all to better understand (and potentially heal) our collective psyche.

And so, we could not be more thrilled to commune with you again to tell our stories, to laugh and cry together, to have a good conversation or two, in short - to be a community again. I hope you are as excited to see this new version of Great River Shakespeare Festival as we are to share it with you. Welcome back!



Great Expectations

ADAPTED BY GALE CHILDS DALY FROM THE BOOK BY CHARLES DICKENS

Charles Dickens wrote Great Expectations in 36 weekly installments for the magazine *All the Year Round*. Because we are now used to the novel as an art form, we think of the story as one, well-planned arc. That is essentially true, but it isn't how it was created. The writer of a modern novel might revise the first chapter if they write themselves into a corner in chapter 27. Dickens didn't have that luxury - the audience would have already read chapters 1 to 26, so he'd just have to write his way out of whatever plot twist he tangled himself into.

Not only that, each weekly episode would have to be about the same length, include at least one exciting event, maybe have a surprise, and certainly end in some kind of cliff hanger to get the reader to buy next week's edition. *Mare of Easttown, Game of Thrones, Breaking Bad, The Crown* and most HBO, Netflix, and other modern television has these same demands. While each episode drives the story, the form drives how the story is told. Popular opinion might even alter the plot as it goes along.

The result, frankly, is a lot of fun for us in the theater. *Great Expectations* is a story that twists and turns with unexpected moments of profound insight. Even the ending is a bit of a controversy. Since I am one of those who didn't quite make it to the final chapter of this long novel in 9th grade English (and maybe faked a bit of my book report - I'm sure this is true of no one else in this audience), I won't spoil the ending. However, the conclusion Dickens first wrote was declared by his friend, the novelist Edward Bulwar-Lytton, to be "too sad," especially for an audience who had invested most of a year getting caught up in Dickens' characters. Dickens replied in a letter to his friend: "You will be surprised that I changed the ending of *Great Expectations*. I support your views, which are excellent. I have no doubt the story will be more acceptable through the alteration."

Dickens was reported to write by speaking each character out loud. People passing his house could sometimes hear from the street Dickens loudly voicing his creations. He even performed cuttings of his works to packed lecture halls and may have died partly as a result of the extreme physical exertion of bringing his characters to life in performance. I trust our actors will fare better, but I also trust you will meet an unforgettable assemblage of humanity. Dickens' language almost begs to be spoken out loud.


Like Shakespeare, Dickens had great compassion for his characters, and perhaps the most compassion for the least understood. I know I have been a bit bent and broken by the last year and its unexpected plot devices. I hope you, like me, will find something hopeful in this narrative. I am certain you will enjoy the ride.



Every Brilliant Thing

BY DUNCAN MACMILLAN AND JONNY DONAHOE

The pandemic has highlighted something that has always been true: we need each other. We exist to hear each other's stories, to help others, and to be in community. *Every Brilliant Thing* is a celebration of the community that forms every night in a theatrical performance. You are part of a collective that can only exist in person on this night, sitting on lawn chairs by the WSU gazebo.

Every Brilliant Thing is also about depression and its impact on families. It is the story of the beautiful resilience of a 7-year-old boy, "Michael" in our production, who decides to try to cope with his mother's suicide attempt by writing her a list of everything beautiful about the world. As Michael grows up, finds love, and deals with the ongoing legacy of depression, the list grows, changes, and weaves its way into every phase of his life.

As someone who has suffered from debilitating depressions for most of my life, I relate to much of the story. And there is some of it that I don't relate to. It is one story among many about mental illness and is not meant to speak for others' experiences. But for Michael, tonight, this story must be shared and received. As Toni Morrison has written, "there is no greater agony than bearing an untold story inside you." Telling your story is a way of asking for help to deal with life together.

We also hope you laugh. The humor is not meant as an escape from the pain, a way to make depression and suicide into palatable stage subjects, but rather it is a recognition that pain and laughter often coexist and release each other into expression. Laughter can be a sign that the nothingness of depression is yielding, if only for a moment, to a point of view about life. It can be hope's whisper that things will get better even if they feel like they never will. And our collective laughter is the most immediate reply that we are together in this moment.

Every Brilliant Thing invites us to participate in a ritual of togetherness. Everyone here is central to what might happen tonight. We can't do it without you. We need your help.

Sherry Jo Ward is an actor, writer, instructor, and professional theatre administrator. She was diagnosed in 2015 with a rare neuromuscular disease called Stiff Person Syndrome. Instead of giving up on her career in theatre, she chose to share her story by writing a one-person show chronicling her experience with Stiff Person Syndrome.

STIFF is a solo, autobiographical show that chronicles Ward's struggle with this disease and, in her own words, is the funniest 60 minutes on six little wheels.

STIFF was nominated for several Broadway World (TX) Awards and Ward was also nominated for special citations from Baylor Health (TX) and the National Organization of Rare Diseases (CT). As reviewed by TheaterJones, North Texas Performing Arts news: "You can call STIFF brave or courageous, and that would be true. But this show is, at its heart, the result of a talented actress and storyteller delivering one of the most honest, funny, compelling, and unforgettable pieces of theater you might see in your lifetime."

There will be a talkback with Ms. Ward facilitated immediately following the

The Maria W. Faust Sonnet Contest is an annual event that welcomes entries from around the world to our artistic community in SE Minnesota – Winona. The contest originated as an extension of the Great River Shakespeare Festival (GRSF), founded in 2004. This was a logical first step, considering Shakespeare's close association with the sonnet form. Winona's then-Poet Laureate, Professor James Armstrong, and the directorship of the GRSF company launched the first Sonnet Contest in 2008.

In 2012, the contest was renamed in memory of Maria W. Faust: a Winona State University graduate in Communications; a twenty-year resident of Winona; an avid supporter of varied local arts; and a lover of poetry. Maria's husband, Ted Haaland, took over directorship of the contest and, under his leadership, the contest has grown to reach poets from around the world. In 2019, entries were submitted from 9 countries and 35 U.S. states.

2020 was a transition year for the Sonnet Contest. Ted Haaland

chose to step back from his role as director. He will continue as the contest's benefactor, with the goal of keeping Maria's love of poetry alive in our community and beyond.

Sonnet Contest founder James Armstrong assumed the director's duties. Heidi Bryant continues as the administrator of the contest, a role she took on in 2016. The contest is now a project of the River Arts Alliance, which provides organizational support. And partnership with GRSF continues, assisting with events and promotion.






